OPP ONLINE CITIZEN SELF REPORTING

You now have the option to use the **Citizen Self Reporting** system, to report specific incidents online at your convenience without attending a detachment or waiting for an officer.

You can use this system to report:

- Theft under \$5000
- Theft from Vehicle
- Lost / Missing Property Under \$5000
- Driving Complaints
- Mischief / Damage to Property Under \$5000
- Mischief / Damage to Vehicle Under \$5000
- Stolen Licence plates or validation stickers

Do not use this system if this is an emergency!

If you prefer, you may still contact the OPP by phone to report a crime to have an officer attend. The 24 hour OPP toll-free number is **1-888-310-1122**.

To report an occurrence or if you have any questions about the system or to determine if your occurrence qualifies for online reporting, please go to www.opp.ca/reporting

From the Tax Department

If you participate in the **Farm Property Tax Credit** program, even minor changes in ownership or farm tenants can have a dramatic effect on your assessment and taxes on your property. It is important to maintain your relationship with Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA) at 1-877-424-1300.

It is equally important to meet the July 31st deadline each year with the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNR) to maintain your participation in the **Conservation Land Tax Incentive Program** and maintain your exemption. (Contact 1-800-268-8959)

From the Public Works Department

Snow Removal: Residents are reminded that it is an offense to deposit snow or ice on a roadway, which includes any portion of the road allowance. Snow pushed or blown onto a road creates a hazard to both vehicles and snow removal equipment and can interfere with water flow in ditches. This practice contravenes Township of Blandford-Blenheim By-law Number 455-82 and similarly The Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, C.H.8, S 181, which states "No person shall deposit snow or ice on a roadway without permission in writing to do so from the Ministry or Road Authority responsible for the maintenance of the road".

****To assist with snow removal operations, parking is restricted on all Township maintained streets in the urban centres of Bright, Drumbo, Plattsville and Princeton during the winter season. Parking is restricted on these streets from 8:00.A.M. to 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday from November 1st to March 31st. Parking on main streets maintained by the County of Oxford is restricted from 2:00 A.M. to 6:00 A.M. during the same period.**

Did you know? Traffic Laws Section 170(12) of the Highway Act which prohibits parking so as to interfere with the clearing of snow from the highway and Section 170(15) provides for the removal of offending vehicles at the owners expense.

Mailboxes: The Township of Blandford-Blenheim will replace broken mailboxes only if snow removal equipment makes physical contact with the mailbox. Landowners are responsible to ensure mailboxes are securely attached to their post.

From the Protective Services Department

Fire Prevention Week is October 4-10, 2015:

- Half of home fire deaths result from fires reported between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. when most people are asleep.
- Only one in five home fires were reported during these hours.
- One quarter of home fire deaths were caused by fires that started in the bedroom. Another quarter resulted from fires in the living room, family room or den.
- Three out of five home fire deaths happen from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.
- Working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires in half.
- When smoke alarms fail to operate, it is usually because batteries are missing, disconnected, or dead.

Turn your clocks, change your smoke alarms:

In order for smoke alarms to do their job, they need to have working batteries. Once a year, old batteries should be replaced with new batteries. When you change your clocks on Nov 1st 2015, please take the time to change the batteries in all smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms.



Green Light Awareness:

Do you know what it means if you see a vehicle with a flashing green in its window? The flashing green lights in the front window of vehicles means that those drivers are volunteer firefighters on their way to an emergency. If you see a vehicle with a flashing green light, please be courteous and yield the right of way.
